NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Whaddon residents have reported possible theft from their oil tanks, and as prices rise this worrying trend is likely to continue.



How to secure your oil tank

Theft of domestic heating and commercial diesel oil often increases when the price of crude oil rises. Thieves target fuel tanks at homes, businesses and farms. They may use the oil for their own purposes or sell it on at a handsome profit,So, it makes good sense to take precautions and invest a small amount of money, if you can, to prevent thieves targeting your tank.

There are several ways to do this and it is worth lookin on line for advice on :-

- 1. Location of your oil tank.
- 2. Hide your oil Consider camouflage.
- 3. Defensive planting.
- 4. Fit oil level gauges and tank alarms.
- 5. Security lighting.
- 6. CCTV.
- 7. Make some noise with gravel.

BUT, THE SIMPLEST, EASIEST AND CHEAPEST WAY INITIALLY IS TO INVEST IN QUALITY PADLOCKS.

A thief will usually come equipped with tools to attack your tank so it's worth investing in good quality locks. Close shackle padlocks are most effective as they offer most resistance to tools such as bolt croppers. If possible, padlocks should be shrouded to make bolt cropping of locks or brackets difficult for an offender.
